

## TOUR OPTIONS FOR SOCIAL GUESTS

### **A Special Look at Washington Tour: Sunday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 AM-1:00 PM, \$32.00 per person.**

This narrated motor coach and walking tour provides a complete overview of the U.S.'s Capital City. The tour includes Federal Square, Lafayette Park, the White House, Pennsylvania Avenue, the FBI Building, Old Post Office, U.S. Capitol Building, Smithsonian Institution building, Washington Monument, World War II Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, the Tidal Basin, Arlington National Cemetery and the Tomb of the Unknowns.

### **National Archives and National Gallery of Art: Monday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, 9:30 AM-3:30 PM, \$38.00 per person.**

Participants will be escorted by motor coach to the National Archives Building, home of some of the U.S.'s most important documents, records and national treasures. Following a 17-min introductory film, the group will visit the Rotunda which contains the permanent exhibit of the Constitution, Bill of Rights, and the Declaration of Independence, and the Public Vaults with its interactive exhibits.

Proceeding on to the National Gallery of Art, your visit starts in the West building which houses nearly 100,000 works of art tracing the development of Western art from the Middle Ages to the present. Following lunch on your own in the Gallery cafeteria, the tour will continue to the East Building and its displays of contemporary art.

### **The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum: Tuesday, July 1<sup>st</sup>, 9:30 AM-1:30 PM, \$34.00 per person.**

The group will arrive by motor coach at the 3-story exhibition of artifacts, oral histories, documentary films, and photographs depicting the story of the Holocaust from the rise of Nazism and the early persecution of minorities through wartime ghettos, and the "final solution" – mobile killing units, concentration camps and death camps. Upon arrival you will be issued an "identity card" containing biographical information on a real person from the Holocaust. As you move through the museum, you will read sequential updates on your card.

### **A Night at the Kennedy Center with "Shear Madness": Tuesday, July 1<sup>st</sup>, 7:00-11:00 PM, \$84.00 per person.**

You will travel by motor coach to the Kennedy Center, our National Cultural Center on the banks of the Potomac River, for a performance of the longest-running play in the U.S., "Shear Madness", a comedy whodunit.

### **A Tour of Gettysburg: Wednesday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 8:30 AM-4:30 PM, \$128.00 per person, including lunch.**

Upon arrival after a 1.5 hr motor coach ride to the site of the Battle of Gettysburg, the turning point of the American Civil War in July 1863, the tour begins with the National Park Service's orientation program on the battle. This will be followed by a driving tour of the Battlefield. Then, you will enjoy an authentic Civil War Feast for lunch at the Historic Farnsworth House Inn and Tavern amidst oil paintings, photographs and artifacts of the Civil War before a 3:00 PM departure for the Hyatt.
